THIS WEEK'S LESSON: GENESIS

IN THE CAR: Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: This week we talked about how God wanted to create a nation of people who would be His chosen people. He chose to make a covenant with Abraham even though it seemed unlikely. Abraham and his wife Sarah were old and had no children, but God kept His promise and began this great nation with the son they would have. Genesis 17:1-9; 15-19; God Makes a Covenant with Abraham.



THANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kids when has someone made a promise to you, but didn't keep it?



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Who did God choose to make a covenant with? What was that promise?
- When have you had a hard time keeping a promise?
- What are some promises our family has or could have with each other?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Never stop reading this Book of the Law. Day and night you must think about what it says. Make sure you do everything written in it. Then things will go well with you. And you will have great success." Joshua 1:8 (NIrV)

This is a great week to remind your kids that people make mistakes and break promises, even when they don't mean to, but God never breaks His promises.
