THIS WEEK'S LESSON: LEVITICUS-DEUTERONOMY

IN THE CAR: Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: This week we learned about how God gave His people some special rules called the Ten Commandments. They not only applied to the Israelites, but they apply to us because they are things that help us to love God and others. Deuteronomy 5:1-22 – The Ten Commandments



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

AT DINNER:

AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

PARENT TIME:
