THIS WEEK'S LESSON: RUTH

IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

This week we learned about how a woman named Ruth remained faithful to her motherin-law, Naomi. She could have gone back home to be with her own family, but she chose to stay loyal. This decision blessed her life and made her a part of the lineage of Jesus. Ruth 1 & 2

HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Talk about the daily choices that your kids make. When they study for a test, they are more likely to get a good grade. If they don't do their homework, they may have to miss recess to make it up. If they are kind to others, the result is being a good friend. If they talk badly about others, they could lose friends. Our choices have consequences whether good or bad.

AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- How are you being a good friend?
- What are some rewards that come with being a faithful friend?
- How is our family being faithful to God?

AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Never stop reading this Book of the Law. Day and night you must think about what it says. Make sure you do everything written in it. Then things will go well with you. And you will have great success." Joshua 1:8 (NIrV)

PARENT TIME:

What you need to know: Sometimes being faithful is hard for kids and adults. We know that our choices affect us down the road. Share with your child about a time you made a bad choice that resulted in a consequence. Then tell your child about a time you made a good choice that resulted in a blessing.

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
